NAACP banquet presents 'PowerNomics' founder By: Melissa Tyler

"Opportunity does not exist unless you have the resources. Black folk have to learn how to solve our own unemployment and lack of wealth problems," declared Dr. Claud Anderson at the NAACP 1st Annual "Joint" Freedom Fund Banquet on June 18.

Anderson is president of PowerNomics Corporation of America, a corporation that is involved in business development in inner cities across the country. He is also the author several books such as "PowerNomics: The National Plan to Empower Black America," "Black Labor" and "White Wealth: A Search for Power and Economic Justice."

This year's theme was "Old Problem, New Day." There were six National Association for the Advancement of Colored People parish chapters represented at the Heymann Performing Arts Center–Acadia, Iberia, Lafayette, St. Landry, St. Martin and Vermilion.

"We're going to pass on the baton tonight to the next generation," said JeNelle Chargois, state NAACP vice president of District D, as she introduced the program.

Local awards, NAACP history and book signing highlighted the occasion, but the climax of the affair was Anderson's speech.

"Black people are locked into the lowest level of a real life monopoly game, and they never received their '40 acres and a mule,'" bellowed Anderson from a microphone on the podium. He said he found that after all of his years in government, business and education, black people were not progressing and are still at the bottom of the barrel.

According to state NAACP president Ernest Johnson, "Civil rights is a battle that should not be fought in America where we all should be treated equal."

Anderson said, "I want to empower black people in the community to make them economically and politically competitive by practicing group politics and group economics.

"My ultimate goal is to speak to those who want to hear and those who





NAACP Lafayette Parish president Khadijah Rashad said the banquet will continue once a year, every year. Chargois and other presidents developed the event when they decided to unite and do something to empower the black community.

"Take care of your own people first. If you're not doing that, you're wasting time," concluded Anderson. "Crime levels will go down. Education, wealth, business and income will go up."

#### The National HIV/AIDS Strategy at One Year

It's been one year since we launched the first comprehensive National HIV/AIDS Strategy and today we are releasing an implementation update to keep you up to speed on the latest work. We plan to release a more comprehensive progress report after the conclusion of the calendar year, but as we mark this critical first year, we wanted to provide some reflections on key first-year achievements.

The Strategy details President Obama's three goals: 1) reduce the number of new HIV infections, 2) increase access to care and improve health outcomes for people living with HIV, and 3) reduce HIV-related health disparities. Our mission is for the United States to become a place where new HIV infections are rare and when they do occur, every person, regardless of age, gender, race/ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity or socio-economic circumstance, will have unfettered access to high quality, life-extending care, free from stigma and discrimination. As you will see from the report, agencies throughout government are stepping up to the plate and stakeholders from all sectors are taking action.

Ultimately, for the Strategy to be truly successful, we need you. The Strategy isn't about what government can do alone. We know that businesses, the faith community, and all sectors have a role to play. The following video above everyday leaders implementing the strategy in their own communities. We hope that you can use this to engage more people in our collective efforts to implement the Strategy and energize key partners to continue their efforts. ### Fondwa Update

Sister Simone, Fr. Joseph Philippe, CSSP, Archbishop Guire Poulard, Sister Carmelle

We are very thankful to each one of you for your continuing support to our works in Fondwa. Actually I am writing to you from the University of San Francisco. Through the generosity of the Jesuit Community I have been invited here to share the great news from Fondwa with you. First a general report on our plan for the last six months.

#### 1) Housing Projects:

1. With the help of FHM (Family Health Ministries), three individual families have been granted a house including Bos Ednor Germain, Paulette and Chrisna. FHM is also helping us build presently an office for the Directors of the School of Fondwa. At the same time, they are paving the courtyard of the new orphanage of Fondwa and they have been involved in making benches for the school for the next coming months.

- 1.2 With the help of Fonkoze, about 150 families in the Fondwa area will have either their house rebuilt or repaired. This project started at the end of last year and they will finish before the end of 2011.
- 1.3 With the help of the Sisters of Fondwa, two other families (Vady and Fritz) will have new homes.
