

Rapper's CD, 'Manifestation,' about holding on to God's promises, seeing them unfurl

Min. Aaron Moses the next big thing in Christian rap wants those within an ear shot of his voice to know that their dreams, fueled by their faith, will come into fruition, if they dare to stand unmoved by circumstances that may suggest otherwise.

"Believe beyond measure; never stop believing," says the Baton Rouge, La., rap artist and founder of HopeMusic & HopeMovies Entertainment. "Philippians 1:6 tells us that He who began a good work in you shall perform it until the day of Jesus Christ.

"So, just believe. When belief stops believing, you continue to believe," Moses says. "When your money don't believe in your dream no more, you continue to believe. When your body, your emotions and every fiber of your existence other than your soul refuse to believe in your dream, *you* believe in your dream, *that you can do all things through Christ which strengthens you* (as Philippians 4:13 states)."

And that strong conviction that he preaches is what his audience hears emphatically throughout his album "Manifestation," which was released in May and can be purchased on iTunes or Amazon.

In talking about the title song "Manifestation," Moses, 26, shares how it depicts his life's transformation.

"At this stage of my life (six years ago), I had totally made up my mind that I was no longer going to prostitute my gift to the world, and I was going to present it holy before Christ," Moses says.

He shares the meaning of the opening stanza in "Manifestation." The line goes: *The realest quote I ever wrote, didn't bother to put friends on it, it's time for it to manifest, my whole family depend on it ...*"

"What I meant by that was my life had to change in order for a lot of people around me to change," says Moses who'd lived a hard life, having battled drug addiction and having buried his mother who died of AIDS at age 45 in March of 2006.

"I was always a leader of men," he says. "But being intricately involved with the yoke of bondage and contrary spirits, I allowed myself and those who were around me to become isolated and stagnated (regarding) the things of God.

"So, when I speak of 'I didn't bother to put no friends in it,' I'm speaking of the time when I no longer needed to be validated by people who were around me to accomplish that which I was created to," Moses says. "In other words, the life that God created for me to live was more important than the opinions of those who were around me."

And when Moses began to put things in to their proper perspectives, he began to see the physical manifestations of the promises of God in his life. As today's youth would say, "This CD go hard." Cont. on page 8

Marc Morial highlights small businesses, youth at Urban League conference speech in New Orleans By: Brenda Andrus & Melissa Tyler



Former New Orleans mayor, Marc Morial, spoke at the National Urban League conference on Thursday, July 26, at the Ernest N. Morial Convention Center, a day after President Barack Obama addressed the conference. This year's theme for the three-day conference was "Occupy the Vote: Employment and Education Empower the Nation."

Morial's speech was backed by his motto, "you can make it, if you try." He stressed the importance of investing in small businesses and emphasized encouraging the youth during his presentation.

"Everybody should have a fair share, not just some," Morial said. "Everyone should have equal opportunity, prosperity with broad base. It's up to the American people to see what direction we should go."

According to Morial, give jobs to our states and not other countries, investing in small businesses. He said help should be sought to train workers, and no one is to be left behind regardless of who they are and their appearance.

"Nobody that works in America should be poor," Morial stated. "When working folks had money in their pockets, businesses did well because they spent money. It's about passing opportunity.

"You got to earn your success, and opportunity starts at home by spending time with children," he said.

Morial noted good jobs, quality education, inexpensive housing, reasonable college costs and affordable healthcare as pillows for the youth. He said children cannot walk their neighborhoods or go to the movie theater, and there are dozens, different ages and races, gunned downed in Atlanta, New Orleans, Chicago and Cleveland.

"Those young people had dreams," he asserted. "It takes family and parents to provide the path for our future." *Continue on page 12*

There are 12 tracks on it. Each offers a candid look into this artist's heart. Each one ministers greatly to the souls of its listeners while captivating them with hardcore beats and a voice that sounds fresh off the streets.

The first track on the CD, "Welcome," introduces listeners to an album that promises to sustain their attention with "custom-made" beats that keep their heads bobbin', anointed lyrics that spit Holy Ghost fire and heart-felt messages powerful enough to make a thug weep. Those who are about that (thug) life, after listening to these songs, will receive an impartation of wisdom that is sure to redefine their definition of manhood.

The lines in the song are "a representative of the struggles that I came through as a child," says Moses, who wrote his songs and is the album's executive producer. "And also, the song represents me as a person beyond music. It represents me as a preacher, my testimony. And also I wanted people to be able to see Christ in me without the commercialized version of Christ.

"I wanted people to be able to take someone like me (as a positive example) who abused ecstasy pills, smoked marijuana, who dropped out of high school, who made countless bad decisions and completely turned my life around for His glory," says Moses, who will be getting his associates degree in entertainment technology from Baton Rouge Community College in the fall.

On the third track, "Keep Me Going," Moses shares, It might be your grandparents, it might be your kids, there's somethin' that's inside of you that's tellin' you don't quit.

"It might be your old man, it might be your pastor," he says in the song, there's somethin' that's inside of you that's tellin' you don't slack up. Go hard or go home, or play sick and stay home. Better bring you're A game. I'm Monday night in the Super Dome. I keep going for the prostitutes, keep goin' for the drug addicts, keep goin' for the drug dealers, my momma had a drug habbit. I seen victory and I liked what I saw, so He must keep showing, it's that thing that keep me goin'..."

In other words, there's something on the inside of individuals, the song explains, that gives them that extra incentive to strive for a better life and refuse to give up.

"This brother is real, and I'm feelin' that," says Baton Rouge radio personality Guy Brody.

Moses says the chief thing his music is written to do is point people to the Lord.

"Christ has made salvation available to any and everybody who is willing to receive Him in their hearts, according to Romans 10:9,10," Moses says. "That is what's most important."

IRS Urges Louisiana Taxpayers to Avoid Tax Scams

NEW ORLEANS, LA — The Internal Revenue Service today encouraged taxpayers to guard against unscrupulous individuals trying to persuade them to file false claims for refunds.

The latest scam recently surfaced in North Louisiana and is also likely present in other areas. It encourages unsuspecting individuals to pay a fee for preparation of a false tax return. Scammers convince taxpayers to believe they should file a return to qualify for "free money" under a bogus stimulus program. The IRS has noted an increase in similar scams across the country. Many scams target unsuspecting taxpayers who normally do not have a filing requirement.

"Unscrupulous promoters deceive people into paying good money for bad advice. Some promoters charge large amounts to prepare false tax returns. In other situations, identity theft is involved," said IRS Spokesman, Dee Harris Stepter.

Promoters of these scams often prey upon low income individuals and the elderly. The latest scam targets recipients of Social Security, disability benefits or public assistance. These schemes build false hopes and are often spread by word of mouth among unsuspecting and well-intentioned people telling their friends and relatives.

"Be very careful of whom you trust for tax advice. Be careful of whom you trust with your money and your personal information. Remember, in the end, the taxpayer is responsible for information on their tax return," said Stepter.

Taxpayers should be wary of any of the following:

- § Offers of free money with little or no documentation required.
- § Claims for payments under a fictitious "Stimulus" program.
- § Promises of refunds for "Low Income No Document Tax Returns." MORE ON IRS.COM

Landrieu SUCCESS Act Amendment Gets Strong Bipartisan Support

Senator plans to introduce stand-alone version of the SUCCESS Act that received 57 votes.

WASHINGTON – Senator Mary L. Landrieu, D-La., Chair of the Senate Committee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship, plans to introduce the Success Ultimately Comes from Capital, Contracting, Education, Strategic Partnerships and Smart Regulation (SUCCESS) Act of 2012 as a stand-alone bill after the same language received strong bipartisan support in the Senate today as an amendment.

Sen. Landrieu offered the SUCCESS Act, which would spur small businesses job growth and boost entrepreneurship, as an amendment to S. 2237, the Small Business Jobs and Tax Relief Act. The SUCCESS Act, which received 57 votes, including support from five Republicans, is the result of multiple committee hearings, including three roundtables hosted by Chair Landrieu earlier this year to explore strategies, tools and methods to strengthen the ecosystem of entrepreneurship.

"It is a monumental feat in today's political climate for legislation to receive 57 bipartisan votes before the United States Senate. As such, I am proud that the great work of the Small Business Committee received such overwhelming and bipartisan support today," Sen. Landrieu said. "The SUCCESS Act is the product of three outstanding and informative roundtables our committee hosted since February and is made up of numerous bipartisan provisions offered by members of the committee.

"I'd like to thank each and every one of my colleagues from both sides of the aisle who helped craft this amendment and all those who voted for it. I intend to build off today's success and offer the language of the amendment as a stand-alone bill. Our goal will be not just to pick up the 57 Senators who voted for the SUCCESS Act today but to win over the other senators necessary to pass this bill. It is my hope that we will revisit this bill again this year and get our small businesses the assistance they need to grow our economy."

Included in the SUCCESS Act are a number of extensions of expiring or expired tax cuts for small businesses for 2012 and 2013 that were first introduced by Sens. Landrieu and Olympia Snowe, Ranking Member of the Senate Committee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship, in the Small Business
