
Not My Last Holiday..... But Living Like it's the Holiday

She has helped and volunteered her time and talent with bake sales after Mass, sickle cell drive, turn outs, meetings, tutoring, egg hunt, and fashion shows, etc. She never knows how to say no.

Those of us in the business of maximizing opportunities for Black-owned businesses have become accustomed to acronyms... MWBEs, HUBZones, 8(a), DBE, and so on. I could probably fill a page if I worked really hard at it. Remembering all of them and their meanings demands that we slow down and make sure they're not just shorthand for continued shortchanging of the businessmen and women we work so hard for.

One highlight of the U.S. Black Chamber, Inc.'s (USBC) recently completed School of Chamber Management (SCM) was the signing of an MOU – Memorandum of Understanding – between our organization and the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA). According to Deputy Administrator Marie Johns, the goal of the document is to improve Black business owners' access to loan programs and other access to capital initiatives; government contracting programs such as the 8(a) program and the Women-Owned Small Business Program; and ensure availability of up-to-date information and access to SBA's extensive resource partner network. That sounds good, and if we're able to achieve these goals, we'll have done something that's not been done before.

What goes unsaid, however, is what this latest "treaty" between Black business and the U.S. government means to us. It means that we have a pact that guarantees that our government will listen to us, and our perspectives, while working diligently to align federal policies with the realities of the marketplace. It means that the SBA understands that a "one-size fits all" approach to meaningful inclusion in government procurement and resource allocation has not, does not and will not work.

It means, too, that the SBA believes that our approach to our mission – our 5 Pillars of Service – Advocacy, Access to Capital, Contracting, Entrepreneur Training, and Chamber Development – reflects our commitment to this critical work. It means that it's easy to see that what we're asking is "... not a hand-out, but a hand up!"

TIME TO SHOP FOR THE BEST MEDICARE DEAL

By BOB MOOS/Southwest public affairs officer for the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Now's the time for Louisiana residents with Medicare to check their health and drug coverage for 2013.

Medicare's open enrollment period runs from Oct. 15 until Dec. 7.

Open enrollment is the best time to make sure your health and drug plans still meet your individual needs, especially if you've had any changes in your health.

By now insurers should have notified you of any adjustments in your health or drug coverage or any changes in your out-of-pocket costs for next year.

The average monthly premiums for Medicare Advantage plans will inch up \$1.47 to \$32.59, while the average monthly premiums for basic drug plans will hold steady at about \$30.

Medicare Advantage remains a strong alternative for people who prefer to receive care through a private insurer rather than through Medicare's original fee-for-service program.

Enrollment in the private Medicare Advantage plans is expected to grow by 1.5 million to 14.5 million people in 2013 D almost 30 percent of Medicare beneficiaries.

Even if you've been satisfied with your health and drug coverage, you may benefit from reviewing all your options. Shopping around may save you money or improve your coverage.

Louisiana residents in Medicare's original fee-for-service program can choose from 30 drug plans with monthly premiums ranging from \$15 to \$118.80 D about the same number of plans and premium range as last year.

Look beyond premiums, though. The only way to determine the true cost of your drug coverage is to consider other factors like deductibles, co-payments and coinsurance.

Medicare's website Đ <u>www.medicare.gov</u> Đ has the best tool for helping you narrow your search for a new health or drug plan. Just click on "Find Health and Drug Plans."

After entering your ZIP code and the list of your prescriptions, you can use the "Medicare Plan Finder" tool to compare your coverage and out-of-pocket costs under different plans.

The quality of a health or drug plan's customer service should be considered, too. To help you identify the best and worst, the Plan Finder provides star ratings for each plan.

TIME TO SHOP FOR THE BEST MEDICARE DEAL

A gold star will show plans with the highest, five-star rating, while a warning icon will alert you to plans that have performed poorly for at least the past three years.

Besides using Medicare.gov, you can call Medicare's toll-free help line at 1-800-633-4227 or consult your "Medicare & You 2013 Handbook," which you have just received in the mail.

One-on-one benefits counseling is also available through your State Health Insurance Assistance Program. In Louisiana, you should call 1-800-259-5301.

Thanks to the health care law, you'll enjoy more savings on your prescriptions in 2013 once you land in the coverage gap, known as the "doughnut hole."

You'll receive a 53 percent discount on your brand-name drugs and a 21 percent discount on your generic drugs while in the gap.

The doughnut hole begins once you and your drug plan have spent \$2,970 for your drugs. Almost 32,000 Louisiana residents have saved more than \$19.9 million on their prescriptions so far this year.

If you're having difficulty affording your medications, you may qualify for extra help with your drug coverage premiums, deductibles and co-payments.

The amount of help depends on your income and resources. But, generally, you'll pay no more than \$2.60 for generic drugs and \$6.50 for brandname drugs.

Thirty-one percent of Louisiana residents with Medicare's drug coverage now get such a break.

To learn more about whether you qualify for extra help, visit www.socialsecurity.gov/prescription-help or call Social Security at 1-800-772-1213.

There's no better time to check your Medicare coverage. Any changes you make will take effect on Jan. 1. (F&S)

F&S: Can you explain how did you put yourself in Ann Pettway's shoes to help you understand her actions of kidnapping Carlina White after reportedly losing her own child?

Aunjanue Ellis: Well, I just imagined what that would be like for me, if I had experienced something like that. I tried to articulate that this woman tried to be a mother. Even under this perverse, horrible and despicable circumstance, she wanted to be a mother. I tried to be this woman who wanted to be a woman that tried to protect a situation she created.

F&S: Who do you feel more sympathy for, the White's for having their child kidnapped and not knowing what happened to her, or Anne Pettway for having to live a life of guilt and confessing to taking Carlina. **Aunjanue Ellis:** Well, I think what Ms. Pettway did was wrong. She tore a family apart. I wouldn't say I had more sympathy for her actions, I had sympathy for what she had become.

F&S: After seeing the movie, do you believe it will alter viewers' perceptions of Anne Pettway as a criminal to a woman just dealing with distress from failed motherhood quests?

Aunjanue Ellis: I hope what will happen is that people will see this is a woman who felt less of a woman because she can't have a kid. What does that say? What kind of pressure did she feel? She felt like she couldn't have a kid in her early twenties. I want women of all ages to not feel like they are alone when they have pregnancy problems. When women are going through these things, I hope they feel like they want to get help. Ms. Pettway did not go out and seek help.

F&S: Toward the end of the movie, We see Anne telling Carlina's mother about always giving love, and not receiving it back from others. She claimed that Carlina loved her back. Did you feel any remorse or understanding about the real Anne Pettway after you had to act out that scene?

Aunjanue Ellis: I felt bad off. I can't speak for Ms. Pettway, and I won't try to. In that scene, we tried to imagine what that meeting would be like. One woman was the biological parent, and one woman raised the child. We tried to imagine it in a way of competition and ownership and magnified it, is what we tried to do. We tried to speak from the reality of what those women had to say.

F&S: Anne Pettway had her trial this year, and she was sentenced to 12 years in prison. Do you think she deserved that after taking care of Carlina and not harming the girl?

Aunjanue Ellis: Ms. Pettway committed a crime of abducting a child. The White family deserved justice. She had to pay for what she did.

F&S: How do you feel about Carlina maintaining a relationship with both her biological parents, Anne and Anne's sister?

Aunjanue Ellis: What I will say is I can only imagine the difficulty involved with a young woman who only knew this woman as her mother. If that happened to me, if I found out my mother wasn't my mother, I would not know what to do. I know that was complicated for her and difficult for her. That's incredibly complicated. I can only imagine, and that's all I can do is imagine the level of difficulty and pain associated with that.

F&S: What would you tell people who have not seen this movie yet?

Aunjanue Ellis: I would tell them, if they could, to watch it. I think it's a story that was told because this is a story that actually happened. It's heartbreaking, but hopefully, the way that we did it was done respectfully and added to the actual realization on the crime in telling this story. (F&S)
